- Ensure adequate professionalism CPD opportunities

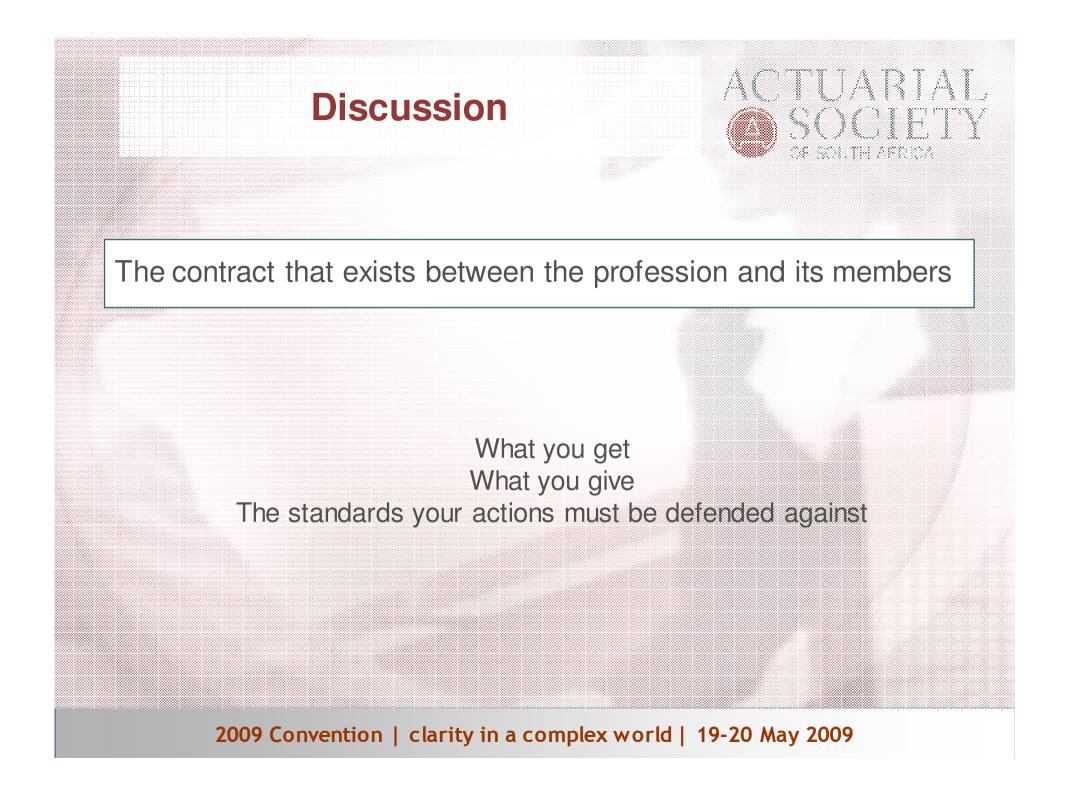

Why is Peer Review work needed?



- 1. Peer review guidance note FSB initiated review
- 2. Broader Peer Review framework "Monitoring and scrutiny of

actuarial work"

Peer Review Guidance Note



- 1. Changes to LTIA FSB can call for review of actuarial work
- 2. No existing review framework ; relationship between reviewing and

reviewed actuaries is under PCS

- 3. Guidance is needed:
 - a) Relationship Framework Guidance Note: to govern the relationship

between reviewing and reviewed actuary

 b) Technical Peer Review Guidance Note: to govern the aspects of work which should be reviewed, and guidance on scope of review

Profession-led Philosophy



- 1. Mandated by Council to look at pro-active review framework
- 2. Working party to look at:
 - a) What has happened in other countries after the first peer review research that was published in 2005;
 - b) An investigation of the extent and scope of independent review of actuarial work currently being undertaken in South Africa;
 - c) A review of the FRC Reports from the UK; and
 - d) Unpacking any other input from other countries and/or professions.

Profession-led Philosophy



- 1. Working party to report back to profession
- 2. And inform Council on extent to which Profession-led peer review

should be implemented

Working Parties and Process



- 1. Working parties will need to do research and prepare guidance notes and position papers
- 2. Peer review sub-committee will act as Steering Committee, together with Advisory panel nominated by each of the practice areas
- 3. Draft Guidance notes for discussion by September 2009
- Profession-led Framework could form input into Professionalism topics at ICA2010

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
